## KEY POINTS

- Fellowship is more than friendship; it involves sharing our spiritual lives with one another.
- Jesus prayed for believers to be one, just as He is one with the Father.

- Unity in the body of Christ doesn't mean conformity, but embracing diversity while being united in purpose.
- Vulnerability and open communication are essential for spiritual growth in marriages and the church.
- We should strive to "stir one another up to love and good works."

5. The sermon emphasized the importance of vulnerability in fellowship. What makes being vulnerable difficult for you? How might an increased vulnerability deepen your relationships?
