RESURRECTION SUNDAY

April 20, 2025

SCRIPTURE

Luke 24:1–7; 1 Corinthians 15:1–5; Romans 4:23–25; Romans 6:3–4; 2 Corinthians 5:17

KEY POINTS

- The resurrection is the **cornerstone** of Christian faith.
- The Resurrection Fulfills God's Promises. Jesus did exactly what He said He would.
- We Are Justified by Faith, Not Works. Our salvation is a gift, confirmed by His resurrection.
- God Has Power Over Death. The empty tomb proves He conquered death itself.
- We Have Hope Beyond the Grave. This hope anchors us, not just for eternity, but for today.
- **The Tomb Is an Invitation to New Life.** Resurrection power invites us into transformation.

DISCUSSION

- What's your vantage point on the empty tomb—faith, doubt, fear, or awe? Explain.
- Why is it important that Jesus' resurrection was witnessed and recorded?
- How does understanding that salvation comes through faith, not works, impact your relationship with God?
- What does "justified by faith" really mean to you, practically?
- Share an experience where you've seen God fulfill a promise in your life.
- How does your view of death and eternity change when you believe in the resurrection?
- Discuss the significance of baptism as a symbol of dying to old life and rising to new life in Christ.
- Where in your life do you most need the "new creation" promise of <u>2 Corinthians 5:17</u>?

APPLICATION

- **Personal Reflection:** Write down a specific area where you've been trying to earn God's approval. Give it to Him in prayer.
- **Family Conversation:** Read <u>Romans 6:3–4</u> together and discuss what baptism symbolizes.
- **Outreach:** Share your testimony this week using this simple phrase: *"The tomb is empty—Jesus is alive, and He changed me."*
- **Spiritual Reset:** Use <u>2 Corinthians 5:17</u> as your morning affirmation this week: "The old has passed away. The new has come."
- If you haven't been baptized and feel led to do so, talk to someone about it or contact the church about taking this step.
